APFutura Telecom S.L., established and registered in Spain, but operates gloabally("the Company") is committeed to improving our practices to combat modern slavery in our business by taking steps, as far as we are able, to ensure that our supply chains are free from slavery and human trafficking. This statement sets out the steps we are reviewing to understand potential modern slavery risks within our business structure and supply chain, and as well as the steps taken to eradicate these risks.

About us

The Company are specialists in telecommunications networks. We undertake consultancy, design, and network planning projects, encompassing inception, operation, and maintenance.

We are making this voluntary statement to show our commitment to ethical trading principles and to set out the steps we are taking to identify risks and tackle modern slavery and human trafficking in our business and in our supply chains.

Our Commitment to Ethical Trading

We are committed to ethical trading principles and to acquiring goods and services without harm to others.

Due Diligence and Risk Assessment

To help identify and monitor the risk of slavery and human trafficking in our supply chain in the Company vets its suppliers and sub-contractors to ensure that they are committed to ethical labour practices. We take all reasonable steps to include anti-slavery and human tracking provisions in all our contracts with suppliers and customers.

Effectiveness in Combating Slavery and Human Trafficking

We use the following key performance indicators (KPIs) to measure how effective we have been at ensuring that slavery and human trafficking is not taking place in any part of our business or supply chains:

- The percentage of suppliers and sub-contractors vetted for ethical labour practices.
- The number of inspections of direct suppliers and sub-contractors in our supply chains in the past year.
- · The number of reported breaches in the past year.
- Percentage of staff receiving training on identifying and addressing the risk of slavery and human trafficking in our business and supply chains.

Training

To ensure a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our supply chains and our business, we provide training to our staff. The Company also requires our business partners to provide training to their staff and suppliers and providers.

Further Steps

The Company will undertake continuous reviews of the effectiveness of the steps it has taken to ensure that there is no slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains.
